During the first public scoping meeting, Chief of Project Management Greg Johnson said, "There is some special emphasis on social well-being considerations in the decision-making process that came out of the Assistant Secretary of the Army within the last calendar year, so it is being elevated to a higher level of consideration versus just pure economics anymore."

Since then, additional federal guidance has further strengthened the role of public input in the Study. "We need the public's opinions to take into consideration values on "softer" or more difficult to quantify resources, such as those that affect the social, mental and physical health of a community. The public has and will continue to be included in the decision making process as the study moves forward." (Bear Creek Study Team).
